DOG AGILITY TRAINING

Looking for a fun and educational activity to do with your pooch? Try your paws at agility! Originally developed from equestrian show jumping, agility is one of the fastest growing dog sports and is open to most of our four-legged friends!

The competition's aim is to direct your dog around

a course of different obstacles - hoops, tunnels, see-saws and weaving poles. Not only does agility enhance your dog's metal wellbeing, all that running around will help you both bond and keep fit ... and deserving of a treat! Obstacle jump heights are classes vary, however, at 200, 300, 400,

the height of the dog at the withers (shoulder height).

Puppies can start training from eight months of age, moving into the competition arena at 18 months. Basic obedience training will help keep your dog on track!

Difficulty levels of comp the Open class allows for 500 and 600mm based on dogs to compete against

each other irrespective of their height.

Not all dogs are suitable. Overweight dogs or those with joint problems need to pass a vet check first. Agility training is held at specialised Agility and selected Obedience Training Clubs. It's time well spent with your furry bestie.
